

ARCH 3900 ARCHITECTURE STUDY ABROAD
3 class hours, 3 credits

One way to learn is to travel abroad and escape the traditional classroom. This is a great opportunity for our students to use the world as their laboratory and get a hand on experience.

Course work will be fully integrated with travel. Students will spend the first summer session immersed in the culture and architectural history of Italy- Rome Naples and Sybaris. We were invited to participate in an international workshop, hosted by the Capri Campus-Italy.

The structure of the class will be based on a 4-day visit to Rome, 4 day Visit to Naples including Pompei and Capri and 4-day workshop in Sybaris.

Active participation, individual research and personal reflection will be required for this course.

At the end of the program the students will turn in their design solution, a sketchbook and a research paper. A public exhibit of their work is to be presented at City Tech.

I will be accompanying and supervise the students on this trip. Overall the students will be away for 13 days and 12 nights, leaving New York to Europe on Sunday June 9th, and return on June 21st

First Summer Session

Day 1- June 9: Travel Day to Italy- Rome
Travel on an overnight flight to Rome

Day 2-June 10: Arrive in Rome.

Arrival at Rome Fiumicino International Airport. Check-in at Capri Campus House for accommodation and attend the safety briefing

Day 3-June 11: Rome Explore Rome and visit major Architectural sites

Day 4- June 12: Rome

Day 5-June 13: International Workshop sponsored by Capri University starts

Sybaris. Travel to Sibari. Check into Capri Campus Housing, and attend a logistics briefing. Visit the archaeological area of Sybaris at 4:00 PM, followed by a social dinner

The workshop starts with a guided tour through the project area. We will stay and work there together during the workshop to have an easy access to our project area. In these days, the students work out the

concepts in groups of three to five people. The working phases are supported by theoretical input by the accompanying guest lectures, sightseeing tours or other events.

Day 6- June 14: Morning visit to the River Crati Natural Park. Afternoon coastal area visit and dinner

Day 7 -June 15: Morning research briefing. Work Session

Day 8-June 16: Sybaris work Session. Visit local industries and authorities.

Last day of Workshop Public Presentation and Farewell party

The final event, which consists of the presentation of the results of the workshop

Day 9 - June 17: Travel to Naples. Visit Pollino National Park, Paestum, and Pompei Archaeological Areas, ending with dinner in Naples

Day 10- June 18: Naples. Tour the town of Naples and archaeological sites of Pozzuoli and Cuma.

Day 11- June 19: Capri Research briefing at Capri Campus in Capri.

Day 12- June 20: Return to Rome. Visit Reggia di Caserta Park on the way. Closing address at Capri Campus Desk.
